2014 has been a year of unraveling for the Eastern Partnership agenda of the European Union. Going from a 2013 Vilnius Summit that created a certain level of skepticism about the effectiveness of this important initiative, the year 2014 significantly reinvigorated the agenda, which became the focal point of deep geopolitical changes in Ukraine, but also in the five other countries with whom discussions had been ongoing. With the agenda back at the drawing board, and a new Summit in Riga on May 22 destined to chart a new course for the Eastern Partnership initiative, these issues remain forefront in the assessment of the strengths and weaknesses of European foreign policy.

In order to assess these developments, the European Foreign Policy Scorecard, published yearly by the European Council on Foreign Relations since 2011, is an innovative and comprehensive way to evaluate the progress made by European foreign policy. The speakers will debate the results of the 2015 Scorecard and share their thoughts on the role of the Czech Republic in strengthening the Eastern Partnership initiative, as well as the future of assistance for democratic reforms in the Western Balkans and Turkey.
