European Summit 2023 was officially opened. On
the first day, it was possible to participate in three
discussions on different topics that united
European values. The Summit opened with a
panel on the path to a more sustainable and
prosperous Europe through trade and investment.
The second discussion was entitled Reinvigorating the EU's Neighbourhood Policy
and diplomatic efforts amid the war in Ukraine,
and the final panel considered Europe's role in
creating a new security geopolitical order after the
end of the Russian war in Ukraine.
